Hail, Joseph!

We find in Joseph a principled person faithful to his own Jewish tradition who would prefer compassion rather than legalism. Even though Joseph did not completely comprehend the implications of his dream, he responded with faith to the messenger of God. Joseph, together with Mary, sought to do the right thing, believing that God would be with them in their own respective life journeys.

Joseph is a model of husbandry and fatherhood, especially in our own times. Here is a husband and father whose role is more of following the divine will than seeking his own human preference in taking care of his wife and his son. The basis of his loving and caring relationship is more moral and spiritual than physical, which is not existent after all.

We look up to Joseph in his selfless dedication to his family. Joseph is also a model of unity for our families and world communities. Joseph embodies the principle of unity based on the fatherhood of God. His selfless attitude to what has happened in his own life is an outstanding character that is needed in our elusive search for peace and unity in our world. It is an attitude that requires full trust and confidence in God for whom, through whom, and from whom, we all have our being. It is an attitude of a creature that acknowledges the complete and total jurisdiction of the Creator.

Like Joseph, we are challenged to be faithful to the message of God in the unfolding events of our lives. We don't have to be larger than life. We are not, after all. We have to go through our lives with the magnanimity of heart that made Joseph follow the will of God in his life to the end. We are part of God's entire plan.

Parish Finance Update



Our operations income is on track to exceed expenses, although we just wrote a cheque for \$22k for the elevator upgrade. Our TIA campaign is still short \$24k of the target goal of \$121k. We hope that our year-end donations will cover the deficit, otherwise we will cover the shortfall from the General Fund which is assessed (taxed). We need to maintain our loan payments, which is scheduled at \$420k per year. Our total parish goal for the Multiply the Hope matching fund is \$510,569. Grief Share Program



Grief Share is a special weekly seminar and support group designed to help you rebuild your life after losing a loved one. Advent: A Season of Hope and Renewal

As we begin the holy season of Advent, the Church invites us into a time of watchfulness, reflection, and joyful expectation for the coming of Christ. In the spirit of the Jubilee Year proclaimed by Pope Francis last year and set to conclude this December, our Diocese is launching a matching financial campaign for parishes called, **Multiply the Hope**. Once our parish has fulfilled all of its financial obligations for the year, every dollar contributed to reduce our parish loan will be matched dollar-for-dollar, up to our parish goal. Even after the Jubilee year concludes on December 28 this year, the Diocese has extended this campaign to the end of 2027, giving us additional time to reach our parish goal. Our goal for this matching program is **\$510,569**. Christmas Hamper 2025 Update

A big thank you to all who came out to support our efforts over these past few weeks. Whether you supplied or wrapped a gift, donated to enable us to purchase the food, or came out on Hamper Day to assist, know that your efforts made this work. We served **679** people and prepared **184** Hampers – a new record! This number included **337** children. Total volunteer slots filled in advance **385** of 417 (92%). This doesn't include those who didn't sign up, but showed to help on Hamper Day. The total costs of the annual effort would be more than **\$72,000**. A final report will be provided later. We're still doing the final counting, but are very grateful for all the volunteers, donors, and behind the scenes parish staff who supported us in this outreach. We are truly living out the parish mission of being a church of outreach and encounter. God is never outdone in generosity.
